

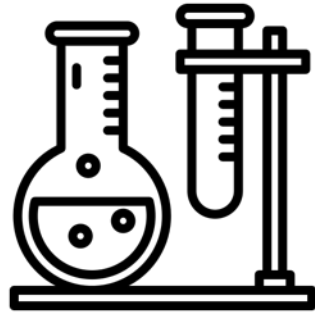

MIT geneticist and molecular biologist, Philip Sharp and Harvard University biochemist Wally Gilbert found Biogen



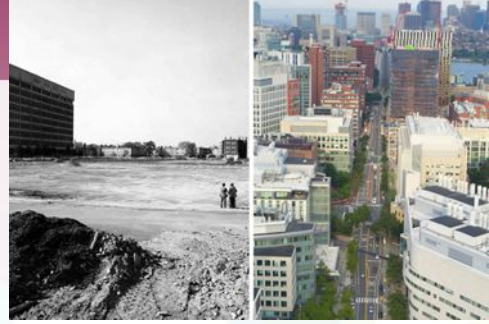
